Praise the Lord and have a Blessed Easter

Greetings! This is my first newsletter article for St. Peter's here in Denver. Thanks you all for such a fine welcome. I look forward to serving Christ and the church in this place. I'm especially glad to celebrate our Holy Week and Easter Services together this year.

Ever wonder why we observe Holy Week? The services tell the story of Jesus' death and resurrection. Why are those services put together the way they are now? This is a story in itself and here it is. About 1,600 years ago, around 350AD, a tourist named Egeria went to Jerusalem for the Easter season. Egeria was a nun and had just completed a religious pilgrimage, but wanted to stay in the Holy Land for the Holy Week observances which she said were already old in her time in her time. She wanted her sisters to have an account of these services which they could use as a model for their own Easter observances. She wrote letters back to her convent in Greek, which was her native language. She describes how thousands of Christians from all over the world would gather in the city on the day before Palm Sunday, and she explains in colorful detail every day of Holy Week services. There were services every day of the week. This account is still the basis of Christian Holy Week services all around the world today, in much shorter form. So, when we worship on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter, we are following in the footsteps of Jesus as remembered by countless brother and sister Christians who preceded us in life. We remember and celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus along the same lines as the early church.

Time has changed the length of the services!! There are sections of the services that aren't always used. For instance, Baptism was always a part of the Easter Vigil. The baptisms were just before dawn, after an all night series of Biblical readings. After the baptism and Holy Communion, there was a breakfast that began with eggs. You can see the modern connection there. Most churches these days don't stay up that way. So, when you come to church during Holy Week, you are doing something quite similar to the early Christians, and Christians in Jerusalem today. Please make your plans to attend this year.

Complete Blood Count for \$5.00

AIC (Monitors glucose level for diabetes) for \$10.00

Free blood pressure check

Participants can drink water or take medications prior to the testing. The screening is hosted by St. Peter Church with Allen Hospital and is open to the public.
