When asked which commandment in the law is the greatest, Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. . . . And, the second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." How are we loving God and how are we loving our neighbors as ourselves in the midst of this pandemic?


