Welcome to the Adventure of Advent

[To skip the nerdy confusing etymological details, continue reading at the *]
advent (n.) "important arrival," 1742, an extended sense of *Advent* "season preceding Christmas" (in reference to the "coming" of Christ), late Old English, from Latin *adventus* "a coming, approach, arrival," in Church Latin "the coming of the Savior," from past participle stem of *advenire* "arrive at, come to," from *ad* "to" (see *ad-*) + *venire* "to come," from a suffixed form of PIE root **gwa-* "to go, come."

adventure (n.) c. 1200, *aventure, aventure* "that which happens by chance, fortune, luck," from Old French *aventure* (11c.) "chance, accident, occurrence, event, happening," from Latin *adventura (res)* "(a thing) about to happen," from fem. of *adventurus*, future participle of *advenire* "to come to, reach, arrive at," from *ad* "to" (see *ad-*) + *venire* "to come," from a suffixed form of PIE root **gwa-* "to go, come." Meaning developed through "risk; danger" (a trial of one's chances), c. 1300, and "perilous undertaking" (late 14c.) to "novel or exciting incident, remarkable occurrence in one's life" (1560s). Earlier it also meant "a wonder, a miracle; accounts of marvelous things" (13c.).

* Each year in December we observe the confusing season of Advent. For many it is a frustrating "Let's hurry up and get to Christmas." time. But the season of Advent has a deep and rich heritage for Christians who are less in a hurry to sing carols and open presents, and more in tune with Christ's promise to return and make the Kingdom of God real.


Advent is marked by waiting and anticipation (for which too many of us have no time.) Jesus tells a parable in Matthew 25:1-13 that exemplifies the heart of the season of Advent. It begins: *'Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. Mt. 25: 1-4*

How we wait, and what we do while we wait, is an important part of Advent. Many see the waiting as an annoyance to be endured like I did as a child. I could never understand why on Christmas Eve we had to wait until all the dishes were washed and put away and the kitchen was all cleaned up before I (we) could begin opening presents. (In my old age I learned that it was so mom could enjoy Christmas Eve and the opening of presents with the rest of us.)

Rather than staring at the time on our cell phones, we are called to be preparing the way for Christ in our hearts and in our world. It is a spiritual adventure that has very real consequences for our physical reality. Because while we wait our task is to be actively preparing the world to receive Christ whom we await. We are called to clear away the obstacles, bringing mountains low and lifting up valleys and making rough places plain. It is an adventure because we do not know the day or time when Christ will come again, yet by faith we know the moment will come to open the big box behind the tree.

And so we wait and anticipate, with faith in the one who promised to return with the best gift of all.


Old-Fashioned Christmas

Mensfest


The ecumenical Men's Bible Study is lead by Pastor McCluskey. We will gather weekly in the lower level of the church at 7:30 am. All are welcome!
