Cheer Up Christian!

"A good name is better than precious ointment, and the day of death, than the day of birth. It is better to go to the house of mourning than to go to the house of feasting; for this is the end of everyone, and the living will lay it to heart. Sorrow is better than laughter, for by sadness of countenance the heart is made glad. The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning; but the heart of fools is in the house of mirth. It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise than to hear the song of fools." (Ecclesiastes 7:1-5, NRSV)

Things are getting serious for the writer of Ecclesiastes ("the Preacher"), and sometimes confusing for us, as we follow him through the labyrinth of his discourse on the meaning of life. Death is better than birth, mourning is better than feasting, and sorrow is better than laughter? What happened to his "eat and drink and find enjoyment in all the toil" statements from earlier (Eccl 5:18)?

The Preacher might sound like he's contradicting himself, but the twist in his argument is meant to show us exactly what folly we may be inadvertently embracing. It's easy to brush over these verses while thinking in terms of standard, run-of-the-mill folly, or obvious sins.

But folly can even look like a daily routine: goals, successes, and our happy, fulfilling lives. It can take the form of anything that skims the surface of life, but keeps us from confronting our greatest need and the reality of eternity.

When life is good, it's tempting to gloss over our need for God. Everything is going as planned, and it's easy to rely on ourselves—not on Him. But the Preacher wants us to address this temptation. It might take death, or times of extreme pain and sadness, to help us realize the truth. Only when we attend a funeral or lose a family member does the veneer start to chip; then, we get a glimpse of the turmoil bubbling under the surface. Only when we're convicted of our great need can we admit that we truly need a Savior.

Are your successes causing you to diminish your need for Christ?

It's a new year. With new people in leadership positions. A new person in the pulpit. New babies to be baptized and new members standing at heaven's door. Hopefully this year will be better than last year and we won't' have to deal with pandemics and politics, but likely not. Still the Word of God remains the same and we can depend on it for our direction and consolation. As the church meets to make plans for 2023 let us first seek God's will and his wisdom going forward. Pray, pray, and then pray some more for all of these people this year. And then Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Amen.

Water & Spirit: Devotions for Lent 2023

Water and Spirit provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to the Resurrection of Our Lord/Vigil of Easter (traditionally known as Holy Saturday). Devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from the Gospel of John. The writers then bring their unique voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.


For year A the Revised Common Lectionary assigns texts from John's gospel to the second through fifth Sundays in Lent, as well as Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter. These texts are included in this devotional. Several of them are unique to John: Jesus urges Nicodemus to be born again "of water and spirit," offers "living water" to a Samaritan woman at the well, raises Lazarus from the dead, washes the disciples' feet, and surprises Mary Magdalene at the empty tomb. As you read the daily devotions, pause to think about how John describes water and the Spirit, and how water and the Spirit are at work in your life.



2022 was a very busy year at Helping Hands Clothing Closet. We had 2572 client visits; 1,283 adults and 1,229 children. Our volunteers gave 558 hours of their time. The 2572 client visits is an increase of 400 client visits from 2021. Our busiest month was August with 429 client visits. Our clients come from all over northeast Iowa. We have been able to help families following a fire or other disaster again this year. Almost each week we have new families seeking help with their clothing and bedding needs. Many of these families have just come to the United States but we are also seeing more local families needing some help.
