

#### Already connected


Our actions in worship are about the power and glory of a God who is made present in our midst. We lift our voices together in song. We kneel and bow and reach out our hands. These rituals enact the gospel, God's good news for our lives, and engage our senses so that touch and taste and smell all confirm the saving message we also hear.

Our basic human tendency is to see any religious action as an if/then proposition. If I bury this statue of St Joseph in my yard, then God ensures that my house is sold-or other, more creative (and insidious) forms of exchange. But the gospel of Christ is a matter of because/therefore. Because God has given us such a rich gift in Christ, therefore we can fully give ourselves to God, and to a world in desperate need of redemptive love.

Lenten practices such as fasting, praying, and feeding the hungry are not ways for us to make contact with God. Rather, these practices are ways in which we come to a fuller awareness that God is already in contact with us—already connected to us in ways we can hardly begin to fathom. As we gaze upon God and what God has done, we find that God is already looking lovingly upon us.

**Prayer:** God of glory, you come to us in humility. Help us to receive you gladly, and in our adoration, to be transformed into your likeness, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
