Borrowing from Luther's Small Catechism, we were left asking, "What does this mean?" We couldn't hit the fast forward button on our remotes and skip ahead. Neither could we plan ahead. Instead, we needed to live one day at a time.


In his Sermon on the Mount Jesus had this to say about living one day at a time, "Do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's *worry* is enough for today." (Matthew 6:34 NRSV) Still, living one day at a time is easier said than done. Truth be told, we are not good at living one day at a time. And, who doesn't worry? Some of us worry enough for ourselves and others even though we know worry doesn't add to your life, instead worry distracts and takes away.

Still, we just want life to be normal again. Again, in Luther's words, "What does this mean?" Does normal mean a return to life pre-pandemic, picking up where we left off? Just as we couldn't push the fast forward button, neither could we push pause and then resume.

In a recent conversation with Pastor Mark Anderson, Assistant to the Bishop, he said, "I promise, there will be potlucks again." In his words I hear a little bit of holy Lutheran humor. Lutherans like to eat together. Rarely do we gather without eating. In Pastor Anderson's words I also hear hope. We look forward to the day when after we gather for worship, we will share food and fellowship again. When we have potlucks again is that when we will know we are back to "normal?"

When will "normal" come? I do not know. What will normal look like? I do not know. Until then, we live one day at a time confident that God is working to bring about good.

A new batch of coffee arrived this week.


This time we ordered from our friends in Guatemala. The coffee is located on the table outside the office. You may stop in and purchase a bag of java to enjoy!

Life in the Fast Lane

Transportation is a big deal. It's also something most of us take for granted. Step into one of our mom's shoes:

She gets up at 5:30 to catch the 6:35 bus to the Central Transfer Station where she switches to the bus that goes to her child's daycare. After dropping her child off she waits an hour for the next bus to come by and take her to work, which starts at 9.

She works a full shift, then begins the trip home. If she runs into trouble she'll make numerous phone calls in the hope of finding someone to give her a ride, or have to pay for a cab, making an already long day even more tiring and stressful.

75% of women entering our program don't have access to reliable transportation. It's a big deal when one of them gets a car! In 2020 we set a record, with 14 of our ladies getting their own wheels:

- 8 cars purchased after completing the Financial Mentoring Program
- · 3 cars acquired from GearHeads
- · 3 cars obtained through church or family relationships



Transportation is no longer a barrier for this rock star! Evie has worked hard: setting financial and wellness goals, following her spending plan, earning scholarships from HOH programs, and taking on a part-time job while attending school. She just negotiated and paid cash for her very first carl This is what it looks like to give someone a hand up—THANK YOU!


Confirmation in March

Groundbreaking News from Paris

From the very beginning. Paris inspired awe with her tenacious motivation. She took advantage of every program and resource offered through House of Hope. She immersed herself in the Family Support and Wellness program, learning invaluable coping skills and positive parenting strategies. She repeated the financial mentoring program multiple times, creating a spending plan, paying down debts, and ultimately raising her credit score enough to finance a car.

Paris applied for a grant from a PEO group. She was approved and used the funds to say off medical debt incurred from having her children. But Paris wanted to be more than just self-sufficient; she wanted to own a home.

Parts worked trinlessly to become eligible for Habitat for Humanity through the Framing Rope program and was soon accepted. She worked diligently with the House of Hope Case Management Toam to complete all paperwork and attended all home buyer and finance classes. She wasted no time in completing the required 300 hours of sweet equity, all while working full-time at Target Distribution and raising two children on her own.

Greetings from Camp EWALU!


