Dear Body of Christ at St. Peter,

The Teacher, the author of Ecclesiastes, wrote "There is a time for every matter under heaven." Although the Teacher didn't include this in his list, there is a time to say goodbye and a time to say hello. A little over two years ago you called us to come and partner with you in ministry. Then it was the time for us to say, "Hello." Now the time has come for us to say, "Goodbye."

For several months I have felt the Holy Spirit stirring within me. I recognize this because I have experienced it before. It is an intense time of listening to God, asking questions, listening to God some more, and responding. Over the years, I have learned that God is full of surprises. Much to my surprise God is calling me to a new adventure in ministry. I did not seek out this new adventure in ministry on my own. The Holy Spirit nudged me and continued to nudge me. I recall an Assistant to the Bishop once saying to me, "Let's just see what the Holy Spirit is up to."

This time the Holy Spirit is calling me to chaplaincy. I will be serving part time as a chaplain with home hospice through Unity Point Health in Cedar Rapids. I am excited to be joining a multi-disciplinary team of healthcare workers committed to providing wholistic care. Through my years in nursing and ordained ministry God has prepared me well for this new role.

Although our time together in ministry has been shorter than we anticipated, let us celebrate and give thanks for the time we have shared together doing God's work with our hands. Thank you for your love, care, and support through Steve's back surgery. It wasn't easy, but we got through it together. You lovingly cared for us as I continued to care for all of you. With joy we celebrated "Congregation Appreciation Sunday."

This pandemic has been difficult for everyone. The pandemic has provided the opportunity for us to try, learn, and embrace new ways of doing ministry. This wasn't and still isn't easy. Change is seldom easy. Yet, God is able, and God does bring good out of change. We play a role in change too. Are we open to the call and movement of the Holy Spirit? With change comes anxiety. This is to be expected. Yet, remember this, God is with you always and God will provide whatever you need.

My last day in the office will be May 13. I will be here for confirmation rehearsal in the evening on May 16. My last Sunday will be May 23. We will have two worship services that day. Because of the need to continue with physical distancing the early service will be for the congregation at large and the late service will be for confirmands, their families, and guests only.

As one last parting gift, I need to make it very clear that once I leave St. Peter I am no longer available

for any pastoral acts at church or away from church including such things as presiding at weddings, baptisms, funerals, and worship. This is as it should be. This is good pastoral ethics. These boundaries will help you to say hello and embrace your next pastor.

As we say goodbye, I give you this blessing. May the Lord bless you and keep you. May the Lord's face shine upon you and be gracious to you. May the Lord look upon you with favor and grant you peace, in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
