
at 4:00 pm. Please also consider singing in this choir. We will practice at 7:00 pm on Wednesday, December 13 and 20.



What a successful and purposeful event 'God's Work, Our Hands' was on Sunday, October 8th. We had a meaningful start off with the blessing of our Lutheran World Relief quilts and school kits. Sheryl Moeller explained how they were being used and shipped. Pastor's sermon set the stage as to what our goals should be.

The stations were extremely popular. Twenty four more LWR school bags were quickly filled. Four tied fleece blankets will be given to Bremwood. Thirty-two pillowcases were wonderfully decorated by all ages. Both Friends of the Family and House of Hope will receive sixteen pillow cases along with twelve new pillows. Four dozen cookies were brightly frosted and sprinkled. Cards were written and many were decorated with stickers and drawings. Both cookies and cards were delivered to our homebound and residents at Willow Winds and the Denver Sunset Home. Two trees were planted in Forrest Avenue Park, while three parks were raked, cleaned and swept. The Cyclone City Park playground equipment was power washed. A delicious lunch of beef burgers, chips, baked bean, carrots and bars was served with a free-will offering of \$300 being donated to Lutheran Disaster Response.

A sincere thanks to all the leaders, volunteers and participants. Everyone's hands doing God's work made a difference around the corner and around the world.

### FOOD FOR YOUR NEIGHBORS

At a time of year when families gather at tables filled with holiday favorites, some families will be wishing they had enough food to feed their family. Seniors on fixed-incomes won't have enough money to buy both food and medication. And hungry children in our community will be wishing that their stomachs would stop aching from hunger. Having food to eat shouldn't be anyone's wish during the holidays. But the fact is that one in eight of our neighbors in Northeast Iowa is at risk of hunger right now. At the Northeast Iowa Food Bank, your donation helps feed families in crisis.
