## Pastor Pedersen's Points – Let the Little Children Come

# Jesus said, "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs. (Matthew 19:14)

Some children wanted to be blessed by Jesus. Jesus' disciples tried to get them to leave. Jesus' response is the verse above. Jesus invited the children to come as they are. He does not see them as a nuisance as the disciples do. Instead, he sees those for whom the kingdom of heaven belongs.

As a church we are called to follow the same guideline. We are called to welcome children AS THEY ARE. Children are not adults. Sitting through an entire church service is really hard for them. In fact, learning through sitting and listening is not the best way kids learn. They learn best from play. Children are no longer under the old-fashioned expectation of being 'seen but not heard'. Jesus did not say, "Let the children come as long as they are quiet. Only the quiet and well-behaved ones will get into the kingdom of heaven." If this were true, my son and daughter would certainly not make the cut.

If we are called to welcome kids then we are also called to invite, welcome, and help out the parents who get them to church. Trying to watch your kids and be a part of a worship service can be taxing. Words of encouragement and a helping hand to the parents of our congregation is vital to ensure that our families want to come and be a part of our faith community.

So...bring your kicking, screaming, running wild, playing, and laughing children to church. Jesus wants them there. If you are someone who finds children in church distracting, perhaps you should take a step back and think of what the future of this church looks likes without those young ones for whom the kingdom of heaven belongs.
