# St Peter Lutheran Church Tidings May 2022 Projecting Christ to All Generations

#### **Holy Communion**

This has been on my heart and mind since last August when I began at St. Peter. When small children come up with their parents for Holy Communion it truly grieves my heart that I am not allowed to let them share in the sacrament. I look into the eyes of so many and see reflected back the disappointment of being excluded from receiving God's gift of grace. Young children are just as much in need of the forgiveness of the sacrament, just ask the mother of a preschooler. And in my experience their faith in God is often deeper and more profound than many adults.

One of the major objections people raise to welcoming young children to the sacrament is that, "They don't know enough about the sacrament to understand it." My question is, do any of us? Do any of us truly understand the sacrament and what God is doing to us, for us, and through us in the eating and drinking of the bread and wine, the body and blood of Jesus Christ?

Another thing to consider is what everyone who has ever studied the Small Catechism of Martin Luther knows, it is not how much we know or understand about that sacrament that makes it effective in our lives. As Luther wrote:

Who, then, receives this sacrament worthily? Fasting and bodily preparation are in fact a fine external discipline, but a person who has faith in these words, "given for you" and "shed for you for the forgiveness of sin," is really worthy and well prepared.

The sacrament is not about what our intellect tells us, but what our spirit reveals to us. Faith is the only thing we bring to the table; we have nothing to add to what God is accomplishing in the sacrament. Just as in Baptism a child is not required to pass any test to receive the sacrament or recite any profession of faith because God is the one who accomplishes all things through Holy Baptism. We are simply the receivers of God's grace through the reading and studying of scripture and that sacraments of Holy Baptism and Communion.

That's why it is called grace, because we do not earn it, merit it, or deserve it in any way; it is the free and generous gift of a loving God who desires nothing more than to bless us in Jesus Christ. God calls us by name and makes us one of God's children in Baptism and continually feeds us with God's abundant love in Holy Communion.

To that end, I invite you to talk among your family and decide if it is right for your child to receive the sacrament. If so, have them hold out their hands (palms up, one hand on top of the other) and we will place the bread in their hands, and remember the center ring of the tray has cups filled with white grape juice. What is the minimum age? As soon as your child is able to eat solid food.

Taste and See that the Lord is Good.

We share a common mission with all Christians around the world, but we also have a mission that is specific to us here and now. St. Peter is unique because you are here. And you are here because the Holy Spirit has called you to be part of this congregation.

The Church Council is in the process of creating a **digital photo church** 


